## SUMMARY:

Chanel Alford-Campbell, a Technology Integration Specialist at Francis C. Hammond, was named an Emerging EdTech Leader by the Consortium of School Networks (CoSN). CoSN is a professional organization that "empowers educational leaders to leverage technology to create and grow engaging learning environments". CoSN member districts represent over 13 million students. Emerging EdTech Leaders are leaders making a difference in the field of educational technology, representing various backgrounds and working with diverse populations of students.

Chanel was one of five Emerging EdTech Leaders from across the country recognized at the CoSN conference in Portland on April 1st. Nominees for the award were narrowed to a group of finalists and the five recipients were selected through a national poll. This year's recipient class represented the first all-female cohort.
