Cognitive Model of Reading (McKenna & Stahl, 2009)




FIGURE 1.2. Cognitive model.

Balanced Literacy: Gradual Release

A balanced literacy approach uses a gradual release of responsibility with the goal of creating skilled, independent readers. Literacy instruction includes phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary instruction with varying degrees of focus across the stages of readers. Interactive discourse and writing are integrated throughout to support students' reading development.
